


HARROW COLLEGE



LOCATION



LONDON

HCUC is located within one of the most cosmopolitan cities in the world! Surrounded by vibrant culture and hundreds of exciting things to do, our campuses are located in Transport for London Travelcard zones 5 and 6 and are just a short train journey away from the centre of London, so students can enjoy the great range of attractions and activities that our great city has to offer. The areas around our campuses are multiculturally diverse and most nationalities find a 'home away from home' community while they are here.

HARROW-ON-THE-HILL CAMPUS

This campus is just 10 miles from central London attractions and entertainment. Harrow College is close to the famous Wembley Stadium and has a wide variety of activities you can fill your time with. There are two major shopping centres and a huge variety of shops to suit different tastes as well as restaurants, fast food outlets and a large cinema. There are many parks, gyms and a large leisure centre – so there are plenty of options for sporting types. Harrow-on-the-Hill has excellent transport links. The station is only a three minute walk away and is linked to the Metropolitan line, easily within reach of Baker Street and King's Cross stations. Harrow bus station is nearby.

HARROW WEALD CAMPUS

This campus has enjoyed a number of recent re-development projects including a brand new Health & Social Care (Seacole) building. This amazing facility includes a domestic care suite, orthopaedic care suite, nutrition laboratory, exercise suite, triage room and IT facilities to support learning and development. A dedicated centre for Art & Design (Hadid) is also located here.

Harrow Weald Campus has good transport links with multiple bus routes within walking distance. It is also served by Harrow and Wealdstone station (Bakerloo line and national rail to Euston), which is a short bus journey away.



LOCATION



UXBRIDGE CAMPUS

Uxbridge is our largest campus and is located in west London. Its great transport links mean that you can be in the centre of London in under an hour. The Uxbridge Campus is just minutes from Uxbridge town centre, which boasts a large number of stores, a nine screen cinema, and a variety of places to eat and drink.

Uxbridge has two main shopping malls – Intu and The Pavilions. Both of these shopping centres have a great range of popular brand and independent stores. Pavement cafes, coffee shops filled with comfy sofas, traditional and modern pubs and bars make Uxbridge a great place to relax and socialise with friends and family.

Uxbridge College is easily accessible by public transport. The campus is just a short distance from Uxbridge Tube Station and on more than a dozen bus routes.



HAYES CAMPUS


Hayes Campus is part of a complex which includes a health centre, a recreation ground, housing, and a day centre for the elderly. It is a few yards from the Uxbridge Road – one of the area's major transport routes and is close to Hayes & Harlington Station. It is in the heart of west London's multicultural community.

Hayes Campus is well placed for access by bus. It is less than two miles from Hayes & Harlington train station, which offers direct access into central London.



LONDON AIRPORTS


HCUC has good links with all London airports. Our campuses are easily accessible via major routes and close to London Heathrow. Gatwick, Stansted, Luton and London City Airports are all accessible via high speed rail links from London.



FREE BUS TRAVEL & DISCOUNTED TRAIN TRAVEL

Full-time students aged 16-18 and living in a London borough can apply for a 16+ Zip Oyster photocard giving them free travel on buses and discount travel on the Tube. Full-time students aged 19 and over can apply for an 18+ Student Oyster photocard providing 30% discount on travel cards and bus season tickets.

PRE-UNIVERSITY PROGRAMMES

Our pre-university programmes are designed to enable students to progress onto the first year of a Bachelors degree. Students can study a vocational Level 3 qualification, A Levels or Foundation Access course. See the following pages for available courses.

VOCATIONAL LEVEL 3 QUALIFICATIONS - PEARSON BTEC/UAL

Our vocational courses are planned with your future career in mind so you will learn the things you really need to help you go from college straight into work or university. Lectures focus on the practical things you need to know, and the behind the scenes knowledge required for the workplace.

You can also go on to develop your vocational skills with a degree course at college or university. Last year 91% of our BTEC/UAL students progressed onto a University/Higher Education course.



WEST LONDON

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West London Institute of Technology (WLIoT)

HCUC is one of only 12 institutions in the UK confirmed as an Institute of Technology (IoT). The government has established IoTs, which are collaborations between further education (FE) providers, universities and employers. WLIoT, based on our Uxbridge Campus, is proud to partner with Brunel University London, Fujitsu, Heathrow and West London Business.

WLIoT specialises in delivering higher technical education, with a focus on STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and mathematics), to enhance the skills and knowledge needed for industry.

A LEVELS - THE GOLD STANDARD

An A Level programme is the UK's gold standard for university entry and will help you achieve the grades you need to apply for the UK's leading universities including Oxford and Cambridge.

A Levels are recognised all over the globe and achieving good grades will ensure you get to choose from the world's most pre-eminent universities. Last year, 97% of our A Level students progressed into universities in the UK and abroad.

A Levels are studied over two years. Most students study three subjects and the final assessment is based on end of course exams which determine your grasp of the subject as a whole. The A Level model offers flexibility to students and will give you the chance to study what you want in great depth.

FOUNDATION DIPLOMA (ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION)

Our Access to Higher Education Diplomas are for students who are looking to progress onto Higher Education/university studies. The courses are intensive and of one year duration. They are suitable for applicants who are over the age of 19. Last year 86% of our Access Diploma students progressed onto Higher Education courses at university or college.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PREPARATION

If you are under the age of 19 and want to improve your English skills our intensive English course may be appropriate for you. PATHWAY TO DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Our pathway to degree programmes are designed to fast-track students onto the second or third year of an undergraduate degree at a Higher Education institution. A Pearson BTEC Level 5 HND Diploma course is two years of higher education study, giving students the opportunity to learn more about the industry that they want to work in and develop the skills needed for a successful career. They are an ideal option for those who wish to study towards a degree but would like to attend smaller classes and receive individual support from specialist tutors.

ACCOMMODATION



It is essential that you have arranged accommodation in the UK before starting your course at HCUC.

HCUC does not provide accommodation for its students however, we can provide information on local letting agencies in London that specialise in lettings for international students. This information can also be found in the accommodation booklet that is provided to students on our website.

You must provide evidence that you will be living within a reasonable distance to the College. We recommend that the travel time between your home and the College is not more than one hour.

Alternatively, if you and your parents would prefer that you did not live on your own (this is especially common with younger students) we would invite you to contact our partner Homestay providers.

Our providers are leading accommodation agencies in London and can help students find a suitable host family. This can also benefit you in terms of learning more about British culture and practising English language skills in a safe family environment.

APPLICATION

PROCESS

To apply to study at HCUC you will be required to obtain a Tier 4 General Student Visa or Short Term Study Visa. You must choose a course that fulfils the following criteria:

- ↗ The course is listed in the Courses section of this guide
- ↗ You must be at least 16 years of age on the 1st September, in the year in which you enrol as a student
- ↗ If you are under the age of 18 you must be able to provide written consent from your parent/ guardian that you are allowed to study in the UK.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Details of the entry requirements for each individual course can be found on the College websites or in the full-time prospectus. The International Office can also provide country-specific guidance for the area you have applied from if you are unsure about the level of your qualifications. Generally, you will need to have completed schooling up to age 16. You should also ensure that the certificates are from recognised exam boards in your country. All certificates submitted will be compared to UK qualifications using UK NARIC. We consider qualifications such as:

- ↗ **Zimbabwe** - General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE

HCUC requires all of its students to have a good level of English. Most of the applicants for our courses will be nationals of a country whose first language is not English. You may need to provide evidence of a UKVI recognised Secure English Language Test for the purpose of your visa application. HCUC only recognises the **IELTS for UKVI test. A minimum of 5.5 in all bands is required for entry onto our courses.**

If you do not have the sufficient level of English for your chosen course and are under the age of 19, HCUC is able to provide an intensive English programme to ensure that you can progress onto a Level 3 course in the following academic session.



MAKING AN APPLICATION

Applications from international students can be submitted via the Uxbridge College and Harrow College websites, directly to the International Office or through our recognised agencies. You will then be asked to submit supporting documents. Once received, the completed application is then assessed by the International Office. The application packs should include:


- A completed application form
- A completed application form supplement
- Copies of all qualification certificates and transcripts
- Proof of an IELTS for UKVI test result
- CV/Reference
- A copy of your passport photograph page.

It is essential that the majority of documents are submitted as this enables us to make an offer quickly.

VIDEO INTERVIEW

Once the application pack has been received by the International Office, you will be requested to participate in a video interview (Skype or Whatsapp) with the International Officer and/or a member of academic staff. Guidance as to what your interview will entail will be communicated to you before interview date. Ensure that you are prepared for the interview and have done your research into the College and the course you wish to study, as we cannot progress applications further if we do not believe you to be a genuine student.

Students applying from inside the UK will be invited in for a face-to-face interview at one of the HCUC campuses.





CONDITIONAL OFFER

One of three things will happen after video interviews:

1) A Conditional Offer letter will be issued

If the application pack is complete, the offer letter is usually conditional on final year exam results or any upcoming IELTS for UKVI exam. If an offer letter is issued, this will be emailed directly to you or your agent. An email acknowledging you have read the Terms and Conditions is required by our International Office.

The offer letter will confirm:

- the course that you have been made an offer for
- conditions that you must fulfil in order to confirm your place
- next steps you need to take to receive the CAS
- UKVI requirement for finances to prove you have sufficient funds to cover living costs in the UK.

2) Request for further information

If there is more than one document missing then a request for the missing documents will be made before any action is taken. Also, if there are any discrepancies, the application will remain undecided until these have been rectified.

3) Rejection

If you are not appropriate for the chosen course and no alternative can be given then HCUC reserves the right to reject your application. A rejection may also occur following the mandatory video interview, even if you have met the academic criteria.

CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF STUDIES (CAS)

The Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) will be issued to you once you have paid the deposit of fees to the College (details of the fees can be found in the offer letter) and provided evidence of your finances. The CAS is required to make a Tier 4 Student Visa application with UK Visas and Immigration. Intensive English language students applying for a Short-Term Study Visa will be issued with an Unconditional Offer letter rather than a CAS.

Your fees can be paid directly from your own bank account to HCUC's account via bank transfer or in person via a relative (cash, credit/debit card, or cheque). All transfers must have an accompanying reference stating your name – this enables the College to issue the CAS more quickly.

Bank transfers should be made in pounds sterling using the account details on the offer letter. Please note that HCUC is not liable for any bank charges incurred through bank transfer – these will be deducted from the tuition fee deposit.



VISA APPLICATION PROCESS

Once you have received your CAS, you can make an application for a Tier 4 Student Visa. Under the Immigration Rules, students making an application for a Tier 4 General Student Visa are required to obtain 40 points.

POINTS	REQUIREMENT
30	Valid CAS reference number and qualification certificates as detailed on the CAS. (Students aged 16–18 will also have to show letters of consent from parents/guardians).
10	Proof of maintenance – usually this will be a bank statement dated no more than 31 days before the date of application. You should ensure that this is from a UKVI recognised bank – details of these can be found on the UKVI website.

EVIDENCE OF FINANCES

The minimum amount of money required for a Tier 4 application can be seen on the offer letter. Students will need to have paid their first year tuition fee to HCUC, and will just need to prove living costs. As HCUC is a 'London' college, you will need to show £1,265 per month for 9 calendar months = £11,385 in total.

Please check with the International Office before submitting any bank statements to the UKVI.

NHS SURCHARGE

Most international students will need to pay a health surcharge, which is £300 a year. The total surcharge amount will be payable upfront at the time of your visa application. Your payment will give you access to the National Health Service on the same basis as anybody who is ordinarily resident in the UK.

VISA INTERVIEW

As an international student it is likely that you will be invited to attend an interview as part of your visa application. The interview will be carried out through Skype or in person at the Visa Application Centre. At the interview an entry clearance officer may ask you about your English language ability, your immigration history, your education history and your financial circumstances. If you are invited to an interview be honest and research in advance so you are ready to answer their questions. We would particularly recommend you visit the College website and familiarise yourself with the College and the course you wish to study.



THE VISA

Once you have submitted your application, you will receive one of two outcomes:

1) Visa Approved

This will give you the right to enter the UK and study. Once you have received your visa, it is essential to ensure that all the details on this visa are correct. If you have a requirement written onto your visa to register with the police, it is essential that you are alerted to this before you enter the UK, as you have seven working days to do this.

2) Visa Refused

You will receive paperwork detailing the reasons for refusal. It's your responsibility to ensure that the College or your agent, if you have used one, receive a copy of this as soon as the outcome is known. Depending on the reason for refusal, you may submit a fresh application or submit an application for an administrative review, however please note that the options given to a student who has received a refusal are at the discretion of HCUC.

PRE-ARRIVAL ADVICE FOR STUDENTS



Once you have gained your Tier 4 Visa, you may still have some questions about life in the UK. We advise you to consult the International Student Handbook, which is available on our website at hcuc.ac.uk.



ENROLLING AT THE COLLEGE

If your visa is approved, we request that you inform us as soon as you have made plans to travel so that we know when to expect you. If for any reason you are not able to travel and complete your enrolment, we need to be kept informed.

Once you have arrived in the UK, you will meet with the International Officer and complete enrolment. You will need to bring your passport, original qualification certificates and payment for the charges applicable for course materials and exams – this will be specified in your offer letter.

BIOMETRIC RESIDENCE PERMIT

Students will receive a 30-day vignette in their passport after being granted leave to enter the UK. Students will need to collect a Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) after arrival in the UK. The BRP is evidence of your immigration status in the UK.

Students have 10 days to collect the BRP when they first arrive in the UK. We strongly encourage you to collect your BRP as soon as possible and before enrolment. BRPs will be available from a designated Post Office in the UK. It is important for you to identify the most convenient Post Office location when you are making your entry clearance application. We recommend you collect your BRP from either of the following Post Office branches:

Alternatively, you can request to collect your BRP from the International Office directly, which is based on the Uxbridge Campus.

WORK RIGHTS

Students at HCUC are given 10 hrs work permission per week during term-time and may work full-time during College holiday periods.
